

This is to let you state preferences about dive sites.

To the North:

1. White Rock - the classic pinnacle dive. Beautiful wall dive. Huge vertical surfaces, room for 2 boats.
2. Little Rock - in the same area. Only protrudes about 7' out of the water. Vertical sides and nooks and crannies around it. Look for the swim-through.
3. The Cave - At 75' the entrance is about 20' wide and 8' high. The 'cave' just goes back 60' or so, so you never lose sight of the entrance. Sponges drip from the ceiling and fish sleep upside down in them. The wall outside the cave offers superb diving.
4. The New Wall - quite close to the boat ramp. A good easy dive for return. A wall leading into kelp. 90 feet if you want it.
5. Seal Rookery - Sea lions will come out to play, but that is all there is. It is shallow, with mediocre visibility.
7. Eagle Rock - among the pinnacles out by Seal rock, Eagle rock is a little more protected, vertical faces down to 100'.
6. North of Seal Rock - There are more pinnacles to be explored. Just takes more boat time.
7. The Arch - If the conditions are calm, it is lovely. Right in front of La Bufadora itself; there is a 20' underwater rock arch to swim through.

To the South:

8. Hidden Cove - gentle in the choppiest weather. The 2 arms of the cove continue out to form reefs further out. Follow the east arm across open water to hit the big rock.
9. Tuna Farm - also protected against weather. 50' dive. Rock provides lovely vertical surfaces.
10. Submerged Pinnacle - The top of the pinnacle is a few feet under the surface, but you can see its effect and find it easily except at very high tide. Don't miss the north face, which goes to 100 feet.
11. Zeppelin Rock - so steep, almost a pinnacle, from 0 to 80' dive.
12. The Sisters - twin spires coated with bird doo, making them like candles. Gorgeous dive. Plenty to explore. Go through the crack. 50'.
13. Big White Rock; a sea lion rookery. It is far south, almost to Kennedy Cove. Dale charges an extra \$5 each to drive that far, but it is a lovely place.
